Experience with KfW Procurement for Consultancy Services

- Transparency

 Procurement notices and results published on gtai
- Tender Agents
 Involvement of Tender Agents in all procurement stages
- Prequalification
 Usually 2-staged tendering
 Labour-intensive despite standardization

- Shortlist
 Usually up to 5 shortlisted companies
- Technical Proposal

 Detailed Terms of Reference

 Importance of comments on ToR and Methodology
- Financial Proposal
 T:F = 80:20
 Local taxes



Experience with KfW Contracts/ Projects

- Standard Contract

 Largely harmonized with contracts of other IFIs

 Usually between Consultant and Beneficiary
- Cooperation with KfW
 Cooperative with high expectations, particularly re
 technical quality and ESHS
- 3 Implementation of Projects
 Strong commitment/ involvement of KfW-teams

- Project Manager, Procurement Expert,
 Techn. Advisor(s), ESHS Expert, etc.
- Backstopping/ Head-Office Support
 Important for quality control
- Payments
 Secure but sometimes slow
 Mainly direct disbursement by KfW
